Geometric OR Sunflower Barn Quilt

Functional, fun and fantastic, paint an outdoor (or indoor) 2-foot by 2-foot barn quilt. We are not using a wood base so it will last outdoors in the weather. You will have the choice of a barn quilt with a sunflower design OR a geometric design from pattern options chosen in class.

The sunflower comes with pre-drawn design and will be ready for you to mark colors and tape.

If you choose the GEOMETRIC DESIGN, you can choose in class from 48 different design options. Designs range from simple to complex. You will discover how to dissect a pattern and transfer it to the barn quilt blank.

For all classes: Bring to class yellow Delicate Frog tape (1.41 width is best - from hardware store), hair dryer and heavy-duty extension cord.
