In addition to the **outstanding programs**, each campus offers a number of **activities** and **organizations** to help students

FINANCIAL AID

Even though SCC is the most affordable college in Nebraska, college is still a large investment. SCC has many financial aid options available to students.

Financial aid is money provided by federal and state governments and by the College to help students meet expenses while attending college. U.S. citizens and eligible non-citizens can apply to receive financial aid if they are enrolled in an approved degree program.
