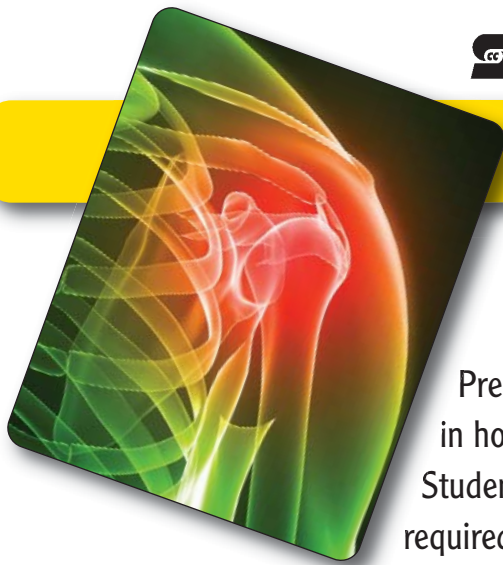


# Radiologic Technology

**Associate of Applied Science Degree**

Prepares students for careers in performing diagnostic imaging procedures in hospitals, clinics, doctor's offices, and private/governmental institutions. Students are taught the safe use of radiation and the knowledge and skills required to operate within ethical, professional and legal boundaries.

## Program Overview:

- Students admitted July and January for eight quarters of study
- Offered via **Lincoln track** (clinical performed in Lincoln; courses offered in classroom or Web-based) **OR Distance track** (clinical performed outside Lincoln area; courses Web-based)
- All prerequisite and program courses must be completed with a minimum grade of 75%

## Special requirements:

- CPR for Health Care Providers certification
- Required immunizations
- Criminal Background Check performed by SCC
- Misdemeanor or felony convictions may result in an inability to take the national boards and work as a medical radiographer. Contact the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists® for inquires.

Program prerequisites: Human Anatomy & Physiology with lab, Physics with lab, Chemistry with lab, Intermediate Algebra, Medical Terminology, Pharmacology, Sociology, Composition, Speech.
