

Nebraska Wesleyan University – Southeast Community College Transfer Guide for Traditional BSN Students



The Nebraska Wesleyan University Traditional BSN program offers a traditional Bachelor of Science UNIVERSITY in Nursing (BSN) degree combining clinical and foundational knowledge, with liberal arts courses for a more comprehensive education. Students complete one year of prerequisite courses and three years of nursing courses.

Students will gain hands-on experience with over 900 clinical hours completed upon graduation from the program. Students will train in a fully equipped skills lab. A preparation course is built into the curriculum to help students succeed on the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). This program is designed for students who have not yet completed nursing coursework nor have a nursing license. The BSN program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

Admission to the NWU's Traditional BSN program is a competitive two-step process and is based upon prerequisite GPA, overall college GPA, entrance exam, essay, and professional references. It is a selective process that admits a limited number of transfer students annually with classes starting in August. Admission Requirements include:

- Apply to Nebraska Wesleyan University at www.nebrwesleyan.edu/apply
- Complete the online BSN Application. The application is open from November 1-February 1.
- Completion of pre-requisite courses with grade of "C" or better (see courses below)
- Cumulative college GPA of 3.0 or above
- CPR certification for Healthcare Providers
- Successful completion of a Certified Nurse Aid course and be listed on the state registry.
- Submission of 2 professional references
- Successful completion of background check, drug screen, immunization tracker, and essential functions form.

After the online application for the nursing program is complete, qualified applicants may write an essay and take an admission exam. The admission process is subject to change and/or revision by the nursing faculty.

The online application is available November 1-February 1.

- The University Registrar and/or respective Department Chair at Nebraska Wesleyan will conduct a course-by-course evaluation of official transcripts to apply courses to general education, academic major, and degree requirements.
- Prerequisite and nursing courses require grades of C or above to transfer; all other courses require C- or better.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU.
- 64 semester hours can be transferred from SCC.
