- 5. Optional: Enter your Additional Registration Information and click Submit.
- 6. If you want to register for additional classes, select **Search for more classes** under "Choose one of the following." If you are finished selecting the class(es) for which you want to register, select **Register now (check out)**. Select your **Payment Type**. Click **Submit**.
