## Advanced Placement Program

Southeast Community College offers Advanced Placement Test credit for certain tests administered through the College Board. The current College policies regarding specific subject areas accepted and scores required are in the table below.

Students are not eligible to receive AP credit for courses in which they are dual-enrolled for college credit.
