## Morning Session: What is Critical Thinking and How Do I Teach It?

This session presents an overview of the stages of critical thinking that nursing students experience as they move through a nursing program. It is essential that faculty be aware of these stages and structure the learning experiences which will advance the student to higher levels of thinking. This presentation explains the stages and how to teach at each level; offering practical ideas and tools that can be applied immediately to teaching in the classroom, nursing laboratory, and clinical environments.

- Objectives:**
1. Describe various definitions of critical thinking.
  2. Describe the stages of learning critical thinking.
  3. Discuss how to teach to each of these stages.
  4. Explain how learning critical thinking is an active learning strategy.
  5. Describe ways to assess/evaluate critical thinking.
  6. Develop ideas for developing critical thinking tools to use in teaching.



## Afternoon Session: Teaching in the Clinical Setting and Evaluating Student Performance

This session addresses teaching and evaluating students in the clinical setting. Clinical education is an integral part of every nursing program, but how does a teacher learn to teach in the clinical setting? The answer to this question will be addressed as well as what characteristics make an effective clinical teacher, the clinical/NCLEX connection, and teaching and evaluating to the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains. The speaker will conclude the session by offering new approaches to clinical instruction to prepare students to deliver safe, effective nursing care.

- Objectives:**
1. Discuss the various ways nursing faculty learn to teach in the clinical setting.
  2. Describe characteristics of an effective clinical teacher.
  3. Describe the clinical/NCLEX connection.
  4. Describe methods for teaching to the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains in the clinical.
  5. Identify ways to evaluate student performance in the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains in the clinical.
  6. Discuss new approaches to teaching in the clinical setting.
  7. Describe how concept mapping can be used in clinical instruction.
