## Make Your Own Compost

Making compost is easy and takes very little work. Discover the benefits of compost and how best to incorporate it into your gardens and landscapes. Studies have shown that home composting can divert an average of 700 pounds of material per household per year from the waste stream. Topics include what to use in your compost pile, growing your own compost ingredients, quick or slow method (is one better than the other?), amendments and vermicomposting (using worms).

## Organic Gardening

From the ground up, we will look at the foundations of organic gardening, including soil life, biological fertility, cover crops, and compost. Learn characteristics of healthy soils that grow pest-resistant plants. Explore options to develop ecological diversity to encourage pest predators to work for you and the use of natural pest control options when things get out of hand. The principles covered in the class can be applied to vegetables, flowers, trees, and lawns. Class will include time for troubleshooting, questions and answers. Also, a brief presentation on genetic engineering and its prohibition from national organic standards will be given. Course instructor, Evrett Lunquist, raises three acres of certified organic produce and is a farm inspector for numerous organic certification agencies.
