### **“Southeast community college – Lincoln Campus**

The following information is provided to help students estimate the total cost of attending Southeast Community College–Lincoln Campus. Amounts are based on full-time enrollment.

The Fire Protection program requires a minimum of 100 quarter credit hours to graduate. The program is delivered over six terms. Quarterly tuition, books, fees, and supplies will vary depending on the number of classes taken each quarter. The following shows the approximate costs.

To determine overall costs, students should plan a budget that includes the above expenses as well as room, meals, clothing, laundry, medical care, recreation and entertainment, transportation, insurance, etc.

Tuition is based on a Nebraska Resident rate of \$47 per credit hour and a fee of \$1 per credit hour.

For out-of-state tuition costs, the rate is \$57.50 per credit hour with a fee of \$1 per credit hour.
