

ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING (Advanced Placement – transfer student) PROGRAM-ADVISING SHEET

The Associate Degree Nursing program accepts transfer nursing students on a space available basis. Advanced placement in the Associate Degree Nursing program at Southeast Community College – Lincoln Campus is possible for nursing students who have:

- Successfully completed one medical-surgical nursing course with clinical in another program, which is eligible for transfer credit. The nursing student must obtain a grade of 75% or higher in the classroom theory and Pass (P) in the skills lab and clinical education for each nursing course (to be submitted with application items –see checklist under **Applying to the Program**).
- Provided evidence of “good standing” with current nursing program including a signed letter from the nursing program dean or director stating compliance with all policies and guidelines of the nursing program and is regarding to have full access to nursing courses at the present time (to be submitted with application items –see checklist under **Applying to the Program**).

APPLYING TO THE PROGRAM

To be considered eligible to apply for transfer to the Associate Degree Nursing program, the following items must be submitted all together to the Admissions Office during the open application period (see timeline for dates):

- Submit college(s) and nursing catalog with a listing of the curriculum
- Submit official transcript(s), course outline(s), and syllabi within the last 5 years
- New paper application for the Associate Degree Nursing program
- Program-Advising Sheet (documenting science and general education course information and required GPA)
- Transcripts from high school or GED and other colleges (If you have taken ANY of the required courses at another college, you must submit an official copy of your transcript to SCC – Admissions Office, 8800 ‘O’ Street, Lincoln, NE 68520, prior to turn in day.)
- TEAS Individual Performance Profile
- Written Personal Statement
- Two References (See attached reference forms for more information. References must be postmarked by the application deadline.)
- Current CPR card for the Healthcare Provider, American Heart Association or American Red Cross only
- Must have passed the “Nursing Assistant” course and be on “Active Status” on the Nebraska registry.

SPECIAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

The following must be completed and submitted prior to enrolling in the core Associate Degree Nursing (NURS) classes.

1. Submit completed Health Statement to the Health Sciences Division, Office B-4.
2. A Criminal Background Check will be required of each student in the Associate Degree Nursing program.
 - SCC will assess a non-refundable fee of \$45 to the student account. Based on the outcome of the background check, a student may be prevented from taking certain courses, accessing certain laboratory experiences, or completing program.
 - Please note: Misdemeanor or felony convictions may prevent a graduate from acquiring a state license. (Contact the State Board of Nursing with questions.)
3. Students admitted to a Health Sciences program at Southeast Community College requiring a clinical rotation at a contracted healthcare facility will be required to submit to initial drug and alcohol testing prior to the first clinical rotation.
 - SCC will assess a non-refundable fee of \$35.00 to the student account.
4. A two-step skin test for tuberculosis is required.
5. Flu immunization is required.
6. All NURS courses completed with a grade of 75% (C+) or higher to progress through the program.

* Please notify us, in writing, if your address, phone number, or email changes. We periodically contact students with time-sensitive documents that require your response in regards to your acceptance. If we are unable to reach you by mail, phone, or email, we may have to cancel your acceptance in order to ensure that other students have an opportunity to enroll.
