

SCC Radiologic Technology Program Admission Checklist

The admission checklist will assist you in completing the online Health Sciences application. Please complete the following requirements prior to submitting your application to the program.

The Radiologic Technology program accepts new students in the fall term and is 3 semesters and 1 summer term (18 months).

- Select Program Option:**
 - Online:** This track offers classroom instruction in an online format with clinical/lab completed at an area hospital outside of Lincoln. Acceptance to the online track is dependent on the availability of student openings at the clinical site. Contact the Program Chair for available clinical sites.
 - Face to Face:** The traditional track is offered on the Lincoln campus with clinical at the Lincoln hospitals.
- Meet with Health Sciences Advisor:** Schedule an appointment with Becky Kramer at 402-437-2688 or healthprograms@southeast.edu. To make the most of your advising appointment bring your placement scores and College transcripts if applicable.
- Complete Program and General Education Requirements:** Students must receive a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 in the sciences and 2.5 in general education courses for admission into the program. Courses can be taken at SCC or any accredited college/university but must meet SCC requirement for transfer.

- Request Official Transcripts** from other college/universities if transferring courses to SCC. Transcripts must be sent directly to the SCC Admissions Office, 8800 O Street Lincoln, NE 68520.

- **Special Program Requirements:** Submit the following documents at the time of completing application to the Health Sciences Office (Room B4):
 - Proof of current CPR for Healthcare Providers American Heart Certification BLS or the American Red Cross Professional Rescuer and Healthcare Provider.
 - Complete Student Health Statement (see documentation form on program webpage)
 - Complete current Tuberculosis two-step skin test (see documentation form on program webpage)

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE RADIOLOGY PROGRAM

The Radiology Program consists of didactic courses (face-to-face or online) and clinical courses for hands-on knowledge and skill. Clinical is performed at preapproved hospital sites that have met program requirements and accreditation standards. Contact the program for clinical site inquiries.

Students perform 21 -28 hours of clinical per week with some evening and weekend rotations. Students are responsible for all transportation to clinical rotations and will spend time in radiology, surgery, and emergency departments. To avoid conflicts with favoritism or claims of partiality, students will NOT be placed in the same area that a relative is employed. Students interact with computers daily. It is highly suggested that if you lack computer skills, you take a computer technology course.

Students taking online courses are required to attend a 2-3 day workshop at the Lincoln campus in specific quarters of the program. Students are responsible for travel and lodging expenses for the workshop.

At the end of the program, students are eligible to take the national examination of the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) and apply for state licensure. **If you have a felony or misdemeanor in your background**, you may not be allowed to sit for the national registry. Individuals who have been convicted of or plead guilty to a crime, may file a pre-application with the ARRT in order to obtain a ruling on the impact of their eligibility for examination (there is a cost for this).
