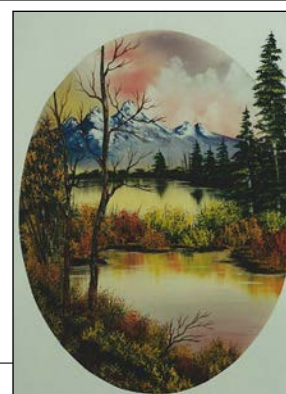

The "Trip Around the World" pattern is squares radiating from the center out to the borders. It's a dramatic look with your light and dark color choices. There will be some preparation for you to do before the actual day of class (such as picking your fabric and cutting strips).

First Session (Fabric requirements—*Tues., July 23, from 6-8 p.m., Room 406*)
Prior to the actual sewing day we will be having a short class on how to pick your fabric colors/prints and how to use a rotary cutter/mat and ruler, all essential tools for quick and easy fabric cutting. If you have fabric scraps you would like to use, there will be suggestions for that, too. This session is where you will receive your cutting directions and have your questions answered.
