- Courses must have a grade of C- or higher to be considered for transfer, though some programs have different requirements. See specific program requirements for more details.
- Students must complete a total of 126 semester hours to earn a bachelor's degree from NWU. A maximum of 64 semester hours can be transferred from SCC.
