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NEW! How to Weed Your Pollinator Garden

Be ready to maintain your pollinator garden, and get a head start on spring. Learn to distinguish common weeds from native pollinator plants. Understand plant placement and weeding schedules that hinder weed growth without the use of harmful chemicals.

Take home pollinator garden resources easily accessed on your phone and in the local community, along with a link to a weeding guide focusing on southeast Nebraska native plants that should stay and those that must go.

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NEW! Small Scale Hemp Farming: Growing & Starting Hemp Indoors

It is recommended that you take the Small Scale Hemp Farming class (LLLX-2000) first, however it is not required.

The 2019 Legislature passed into law the farm bill which would allow hemp farming in Nebraska. Acreage owners and home gardeners can get a head start on your spring hemp crop by starting your plants indoors in the winter. This will eliminate feral hemp pollen in the air, allow for increased crops per year and prepare you early to sell your crop. Dave Sanders will lead this class that will cover: feminized seeds, genetics, lighting schedules, soil types, growing cycle, sexing plants and insects and prevention.

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Small Scale Hemp Farming

From seed to harvest to processing, acreage owners and home gardeners are asking a lot of hemp questions. Since the 2019 Legislature passed into law the farm bill which would allow hemp farming in Nebraska, it is time to learn what all is involved in this process for the small producer. Dave Sanders will lead this class that will cover licenses /permits, seed sources / seed sexing, soil types, growing cycle, sexing plants, identification of the parts of the plant, insects/ prevention, harvest time/drying and lab tests required to comply with the law.

You must have an email account to register online.

- Go to <http://bit.ly/RegisterCE>
- Search for your class** by entering a **key word** in the title or the **course number**. Click **Submit**. (Enter information in only one field for broader results.)
Key Word Example: *Driver*
Course Number Example: *TRAN-3398*
- Select the course** for which you wish to register. Click **Submit**.
- Enter your **personal information, certify your identification** and click **Submit**.
* You must provide your Social Security Number.
- Optional:** Enter your **Additional Registration Information** and click **Submit**.
