NEW! Small Scale Hemp Farming: Growing & Starting Hemp Indoors

It is recommended that you take the Small Scale Hemp Farming class (LLLX-2000) first, however it is not required.

The 2019 Legislature passed into law the farm bill which would allow hemp farming in Nebraska. Acreage owners and home gardeners can get a head start on your spring hemp crop by starting your plants indoors in the winter. This will eliminate feral hemp pollen in the air, allow for increased crops per year and prepare you early to sell your crop. Dave Sanders will lead this class that will cover: feminized seeds, genetics, lighting schedules, soil types, growing cycle, sexing plants and insects and prevention.

Disclaimer: This class and its contents are solely intended for the purpose of preparing potential small-scale producers to become more familiar with the challenges and rewards of growing hemp with no more than 0.03% THC, as permitted by law.
