Courses from SCC that will apply towards the UNMC Traditional/Accelerated BSN Program prerequisite requirements

Admission Criteria:

- A minimum grade of C+ is required in each prerequisite course.
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) for prerequisite courses.
- A minimum of 12 prerequisites (out of 17) must be completed to apply to the program.
- A maximum of 12 credit hours can be non-graded (e.g.: AP, CLEP, Dantes, P/NP).
- Courses that must have a grade include Anatomy, Physiology, Chemistry, Statistics, College Algebra, Nutrition and Microbiology.
- Courses marked with an asterisk * must be completed within 7 years prior to the start of the BSN program.
- Current CNA certification.
- Accelerated applicants must have a minimum of a bachelor's degree from an accredited university/college.

Humanities Elective: course should provide students with knowledge of the history and creation of music and art, or knowledge of literary, philosophical, or religious efforts to interpret and illuminate human existence.
