2. This is an informative speech contest open to any currently enrolled SCC students. Your speech will need to teach the audience about objects, people, procedures, events, ideas, conditions, or issues, etc. (If your topic is viewed as persuasive, you may be asked to provide a different subject by one of the contest coordinators.)
3. You will be judged using the Judge's Scoring Guidelines listed here.
4. The time limit is 5-7 minutes. If your speech runs long, after 9 minutes you will be asked to stop speaking.
5. Plan to arrive by 3:15 to register. Participants will then receive room assignments for presentations. Participants who are not in line to register by 3:45 p.m. will not be allowed to enter.
6. Preliminary rounds begin at 4 p.m. and participants will deliver their speech to 1-2 judge(s) and approximately six contestants.
7. Participants will stay for the entire round and listen to all speakers in their group.
8. Speaker order is determined randomly, and you must speak in the order chosen.
9. You have up to 5 minutes to set up your visual aids. If you are not prepared after the 5 minutes, you will be asked to give your speech without your visual aid.
10. You will be allowed to use the multi-media equipment provided in the rooms at SCC.
11. Immediately following preliminary rounds, participants must return to room V-101 to see if they have advanced to the final round.
12. The judges' results will be tallied and participants will be notified if they have advanced to the final round.
13. Students who advance to the final round will give the same speech to a panel of judges and an open audience in rooms V-107/V-109.
14. There is no dress code for speaking, however, speakers should remember that appearance is part of the speaking process.
15. Awards/prizes will be presented to the top six performers in room V-101 after the final scores are tallied.
16. In case of inclement weather, an alternative date will be announced to those who are entered.

- Main points clear
- Main points fully supported
- Organization well planned
- Clear Language
- Effective transitions

CONCLUSION 5 Pts

- Prepared audience for ending
- Reinforced central idea
- Memorable ending

DELIVERY 10 Pts

- Maintained eye contact
- Used voice effectively
- Effective non-verbals
- Presented visual aids well

SOURCES 5 Pts

- Credible
- Incorporated correctly

OVERALL EVALUATION 10 Pts

- Topic challenging
- Specific purpose well chosen
- Speech was audience centered
- Speech completed in time limit
