## IN-PERSON/LIVE TIME ADVISING APPOINTMENTS

## SAMPLE TOPICS/QUESTIONS FOR IN-PERSON ADVISING



- Do I need another math class? If so, what should I take after immediate Algebra?
- I'm struggling in my Philosophy class, should I drop it?
- Can I take a look at all of the classes required for my degree?
- I am having a hard time balancing work, school, and life. Can you help?
- I'm not sure I'm in the right program of study. Can I get help deciding on a career?
- I'm not sure I even have study skills or a study plan. Can I get help with that?

## EMAIL ADVISING



If you have a general question, you can email your advisor to ask!

- Include a brief description of your question in the subject line
- In the body of the email, include your full name and SCC ID number, and provide as many details as possible in order to properly answer your question. Keep in mind you may be asked to schedule an appointment
- Allow 1-2 business days for a response, particularly during busy registration periods.

- When does registration begin for the fall semester?
- Are tutors available for math?
- When is the last day to drop a class and get a refund?
