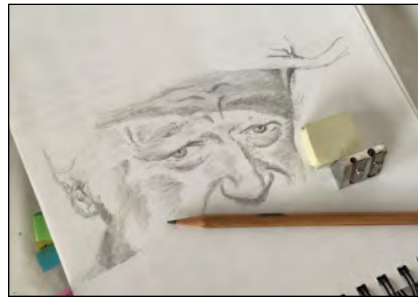
Then each day you will spend time filling up pages using a variety of creative techniques.

- Optional:** Enter your **Additional Registration Information** and click **Submit**.

- If you want to register for additional classes, select **Search for more classes** under "Choose one of the following." If you are finished selecting the class(es) for which you want to register, select **Register now (check out)**. Select your **Payment Type**. Click **Submit**.
- Enter your **payment information**. Click **Submit**.

You will see your **class acknowledgement** with information about your **SCC Student ID Number, SCC User ID** and **password**. You also will receive an email with this same information for your records.

In the future it will be easy to register by logging in using your SCC User ID and password and it will not be necessary to provide your Social Security number again.
