Knowing how to pick the right plan to meet your needs is important to ensure you get the best coverage at the lowest cost. Navigating Medicare.gov will arm you with the knowledge to navigate Medicare's plan finder tool to make an informed decision. You will be provided a step-by-step guide to using Medicare.gov to address these questions:

- How much will my prescriptions cost?
- Which Medicare drug plan will cover my prescriptions?
- Where can I get the best prices for my prescriptions?

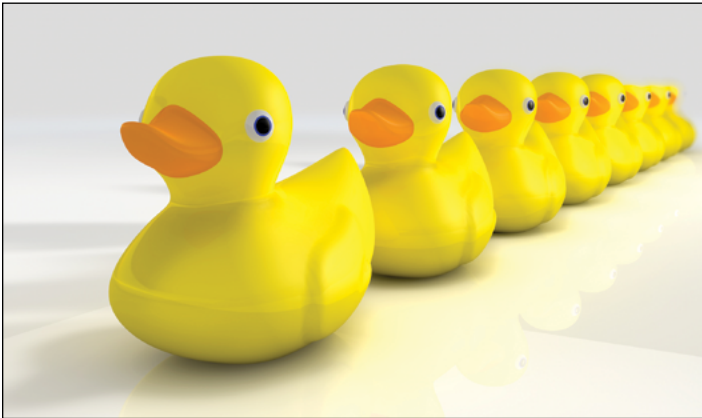
