# **Motorcycle Safety: Beginning Riders Course**

Prerequisites: You must be at least 16 and able to balance and ride a bicycle. If you are ages 16 or 17, a waiver must be signed by a parent or guardian. Failure to provide will disqualify participation in class, and a refund will not be available.

This 18-hour course is intended for beginning riders 16 years and older and is designed to teach safe motorcycle operation.

(1.8 CEUs) Approximately three weeks before the start date of the course, an email and letter will be sent with instructions on how to access the eCourse. The eCourse is to be successfully completed one week prior to the start of the Friday evening classroom session. You must successfully complete the online eCourse and the written and driving exams to receive documentation for the motorcycle endorsement. You will provide your own protective riding apparel, including Nebraska Department of Transportationapproved helmet and eye protection, over-the-ankle footwear, long-sleeve shirt or jacket, long non-flare denim pants or equivalent, and full-fingered gloves, preferably leather.
