

The Midwest Institute for International/Intercultural Education (MIIE)

The Midwest Institute for International/Intercultural Education provides educators opportunities to develop global aspects into their curriculum. Week-long workshops are held every summer to provide faculty participants materials, pedagogical tools, mentoring, and varied approaches to developing a curriculum module for incorporating global education into their course(s). Faculty then develop a draft of their curriculum module that will be submitted to MIIE, and the faculty member will receive feedback and suggestions concerning the curriculum module. The following summer faculty will present their curriculum module.

Funding on a first-come, first-serve basis is available to faculty to attend the summer workshops.

Examples of the last Midwest Institute's workshops are below:

- * Africa (July 25-29, 2011) and/or Latin America (July 25-29, 2011)
- * Global Values, Responsibility and Leadership (August 1-5, 2011)
- * Global Interactions and Exchanges (August 8-12, 2011)

The workshops will be offered in Kalamazoo for the purpose of providing information and resources to faculty for the development of curriculum modules on various aspects or issues relating to one of the weekly workshops. For each workshop, 15 faculty will be selected on a "FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE" basis from members in the Midwest Institute consortium. Each faculty will receive a \$1,000 stipend for his/her participation and the development of a curriculum module to be infused into at least one course that he/she is teaching at your institution.
