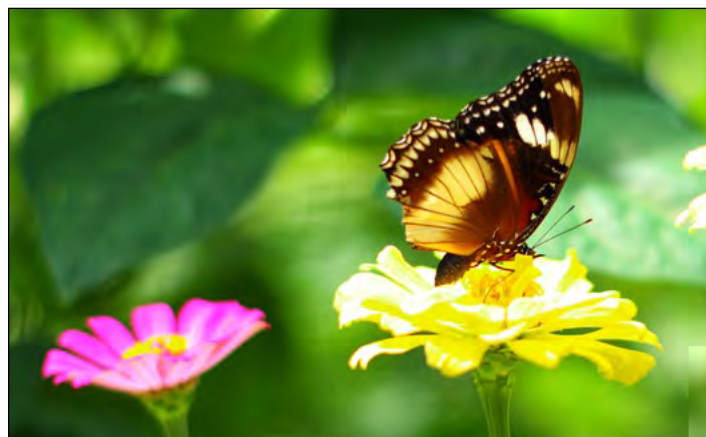
## **Rain Barrels of Fun: Making the Most of Your Rainwater**
