Associate of Health Sciences	This program provides students with a focused transfer pathway into a health sciences program at a four-year institution or SCC. Students work closely with an advisor to select coursework that meets the requirements for health academic programs and health sciences careers. Students in this program learn about career options in the health care field while taking general education courses before enrolling in an SCC Health Sciences program.	No salary information is reported as students transfer to a four-year college or university, or pursue study in one of SCC's Health Sciences programs.	Students in SCC's Associate of Health Sciences program have the opportunity to apply to one of SCC's 16 Health Sciences programs or transfer to almost any institution. Students should contact a transfer advisor at their destination school to determine transfer requirements. Completion of some elective coursework including, but not limited to, nursing assistant, EMT, phlebotomy, etc. may lead to a student being eligible to complete certification or licensing requirements for the specific job. 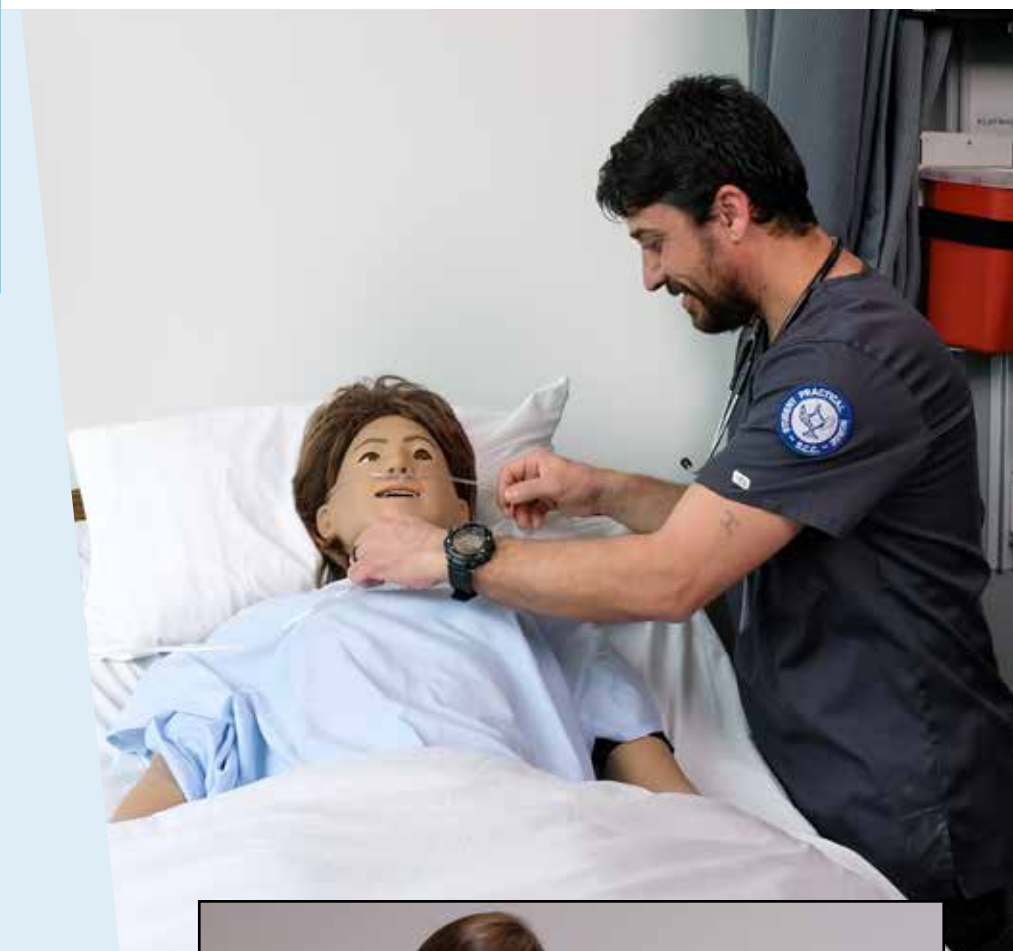
The **Transfer** option is for students who want to transfer their credits to a four-year institution to complete a bachelor's degree in a health sciences or pre-professional health program.
