A successful paramedic is a detailed-oriented, team player with strong communication and decision-making skills. Your top priority is to remain calm and focused while you care for your patient during crisis situations.

Paramedic Diploma	Students learn the foundations, role, ethics, and responsibilities of EMS, patient assessment, and the recognition and treatment of medical disease in all body systems. Students will also learn to implement EMS treatment modalities with pharmaceuticals, ECG interpretation, and airway management. Trauma assessment, injury recognition, and patience management are also taught. Students will also learn rescue operations, including extrication techniques, incident command, and hazardous materials.	\$25.80 per hour; \$53,664 annually.
