The instructor candidate must have no suspensions or revocations on record within the last five years, including no convictions for DWI or any alcohol- or drug-related offense in connection with motor vehicle use. DMV Title 247.)

This is a Department of Motor Vehicles-approved course for the certification of instructors to teach driver education in a non-credit format.
