Criminal Justice agencies hire only the best qualified individuals to obtain and maintain public trust and confidence and have strict admission/hiring qualifications.

Factors that usually disqualify candidates from employment include, but are not limited to:

- A criminal record (i.e. theft, assault, any felony)
- A history of drug/alcohol abuse
- Significant psychological/personal disorders, dishonesty, etc.
