As a radiologic technologist, you will be responsible for accurately positioning patients and ensuring that a quality diagnostic image is produced. You'll work closely with radiologists and the physicians who interpret medical images to either diagnose or rule out disease or injury. Employment opportunities include hospitals, clinics, outpatient imaging centers, and doctor's offices.

- Your face-to-face coursework will be completed in a new state-of-the-art facility on the Lincoln Campus.
- You'll spend time in radiology, surgery and emergency departments.
- Supervised lab and clinical experiences will expose you to a variety of exams and procedures.
- New students begin the program each fall term.

Two tracks are available: Lincoln and Distance

- **Lincoln Track:** Clinicals will be held in Lincoln, with radiology courses offered face-to-face.
- **Distance Track:** Clinicals will be held outside of Lincoln at pre-approved hospital sites, with radiology lecture courses offered online*.
