LPN to ADN	The LPN-ADN Option is available to those who have earned their LPN diploma, hold an active, unencumbered license, and are seeking an RN degree. Students learn the skills and scope of practice for the RN role. Students learn and practice assessment skills to apply in the critical care, medical-surgical, pediatric, obstetrics and gynecological, and mental health areas.
