Physical Therapist Assistant	Students will study kinesiology to learn about normal movement of the body in daily activities and how injury or disease can affect movement and function. Hands-on learning for physical therapy interventions includes therapeutic exercise, cardiopulmonary interventions, neurological rehabilitation techniques, gait training with assistive devices, manual therapy techniques, and the role of physical agents in promoting pain relief and tissue healing.	\$21.90 hourly; \$45,552 annually	Physical Therapist Assistant	Upon graduation, students are eligible to take the National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) for Physical Therapist Assistants. Program	In what term do students start clinicals?	Where do students participate in clinicals?	In general, what time of day and days of the week can students expect to attend clinical?	Will the program help student secure their sites? Do students need to contact clinical sites prior to acceptance/placement?	How many clinical hours do students complete in the program?
Physical Therapist Assistant	End of the Spring Semester (2nd semester in the program).	All PTA students will participate in at least one rural clinical site and one inpatient clinical site. Various sites include: outpatient, skilled nursing facility, home health care, acute care/hospital, pediatrics.	Students attend clinical full-time, usually, Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., dependent on the site and clinical instructor's schedules. Some clinicals may be scheduled later afternoon/evening depending on the facility.	The clinical coordinator will place students in clinical sites based on required hours, specialties, rotations, and availability. Students should not contact potential clinical sites.	17 total weeks in clinical education for 680 hours.
