FACTS

about substance use

Numerous health risks have been identified with substance use. Users can:

- Lose resistance to disease
- Develop physical and psychological dependence
- Become depressed
- Develop heart problems
- Contract infections
- Become malnourished, physically exhausted and even die

For substance users, reality is often distorted, reactions may be slower and the risk of accidents can increase.

- Extended substance use can potentially cause respiratory arrest, convulsions and coma.
- Injected drugs increase the risk for infectious diseases such as hepatitis and AIDS.

Body systems are affected.

- The liver, lungs and heart may be damaged.
- For women there is an increase in birth defects associated with substance use during pregnancy.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Substance use/abuse is unwise medically, can hurt you economically, can endanger your safety and the safety of others, can lead to chemical dependency, is illegal, and is antisocial. SCC encourages employees and students to seek help with substance use/abuse problems or concerns.

IT'S THE LAW...

NEBRASKA LAWS prohibit the possession and use of controlled substances, illegal drugs and alcoholic beverages on public property.

SCC'S DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY

Southeast Community College policy prohibits visitors, students and employees of the College from unlawfully manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, possessing, using, or being under the influence of a controlled substance, including illegal drugs and alcohol, on College premises, at any College-sponsored or sanctioned activities, or while conducting College business off College premises. Compliance with these standards of conduct is mandatory for students and employees of Southeast Community College.

NOTE: SCC guests and visitors suspected of being under the influence of a controlled substance may be asked to leave College property or any officially recognized activity. Failure to comply may result in law enforcement intervention.

DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS

Students or employees who violate the established policies prohibiting the purchase, possession, use or distribution of controlled substances, illegal drugs and alcohol may receive one or more of the following disciplinary sanctions:

- Warning
- Disciplinary probation
- Suspension or termination of employment
- Suspension or expulsion from school
- Referral to an appropriate drug/alcohol treatment program
- Referral to law enforcement agencies for prosecution
- Any other action considered necessary by College officials

Disciplinary sanctions for students or employees who violate the College's drug/alcohol policy may be appealed through the College grievance policies and procedures.

Note: SCC employees and students subject to the College's Criminal Background Check requirements are expected to self-disclose any drug/alcohol related convictions on an annual basis.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL USE TESTING

Pursuant to the Drug-Free Workplace Act and the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act, Southeast Community College will require drug and alcohol tests for employees and students in circumstances where reasonable suspicion exists.

Employees

The College's Human Resources Office has administrative responsibility for implementing and monitoring the drug and alcohol testing procedures for employees. Students

There are numerous drug and alcohol counseling, treatment and rehabilitation centers located within the 15-county area of southeast Nebraska.

Any of the resources listed on the back of this brochure can also provide information and assessment relating to drug and alcohol abuse. In addition, they can furnish schedules for local and area meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, Alanon, Adult Children of Alcoholics, Alateen and Alatot.

Both inpatient and outpatient centers offer help for the entire family of the alcoholic or drug user.
